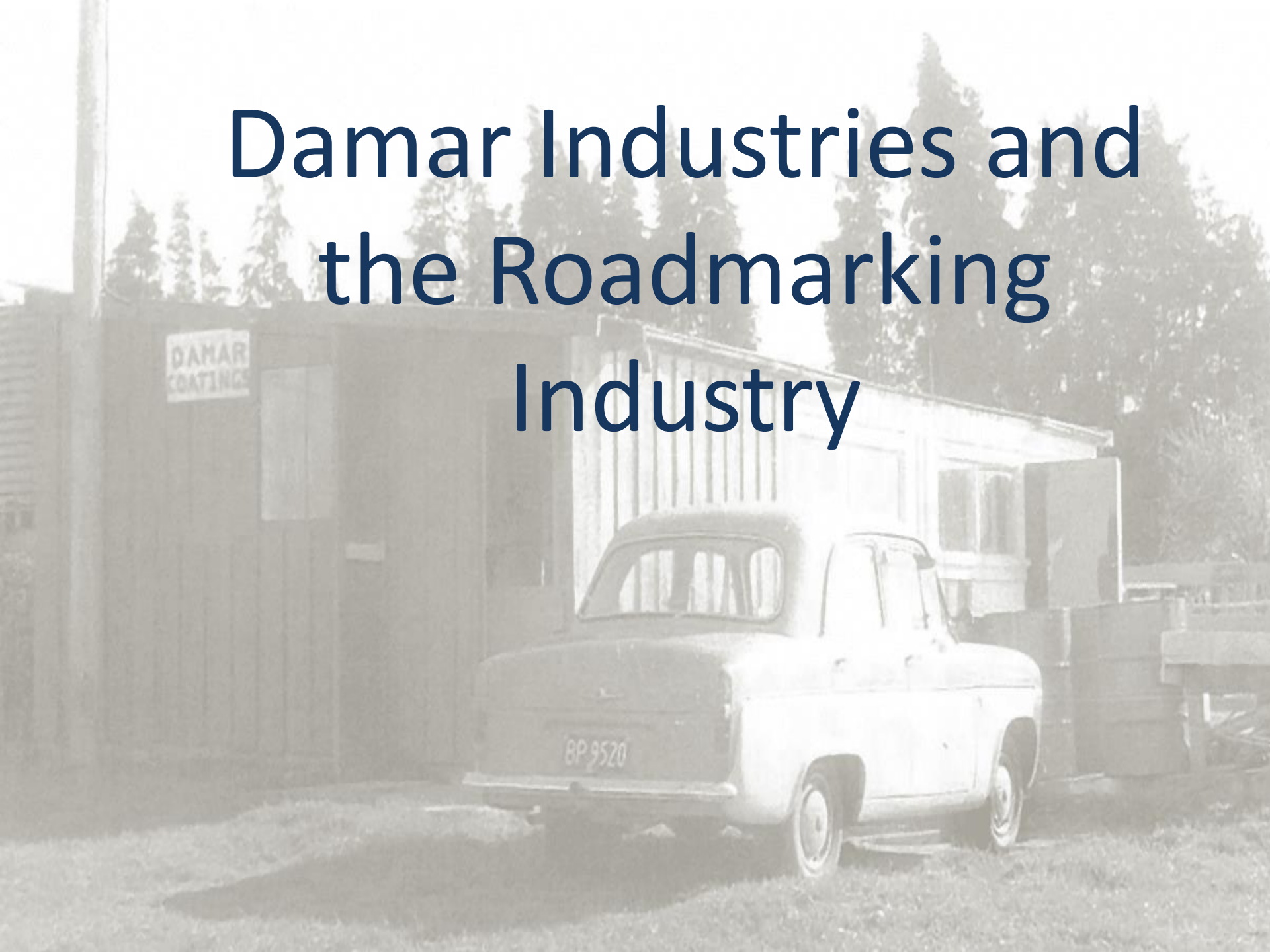

- March. The Company was split into Bay Of Plenty Industrial Paints and The Paint Factory
- April. Bay Of Plenty Industrial Paints obtains Transit New Zealand approval to supply the Roadmarking Industry
- October. Purchased Damar Industrial Paints Ltd in Tauranga and relocated it into Rotorua. The Name Damar industrial Paints is adopted.

- Appointed David Goddard in October as Technical Manager

- May. Achieved ISO9001 Accreditation

1997

- February. 1st Paint Supplied in Pallecons in New Zealand
- August. Appointed as Principal Sponsor for the NZRF Conference in Christchurch
- November. Appointed as the New Zealand member of the US based Colour Guild International Group, CGIG and the Coatings Research Group Incorporated CRGI
